

What if you were told an hour of your time could change someone's life? It can! In the few minutes it takes to read this article, nearly 100 people will receive lifesaving blood transfusions.

The Health and Wellness committee is hosting a blood drive Thursday, September 21, from 2pm – 6:30pm at the Palos Heights Recreation Center Orchard Room. We encourage every member who can donate to join us and bring a friend as well. Appointments can be made by contacting: Sue DeKoker trumpetvine2000@yahoo.com or Theresa Karstrand tmkarstrand@gmail.com. Every donor will save up to THREE lives. Please allow about an hour, including registration and check in. Actual donating takes about 10 minutes, after which you will relax in our refreshment area for at least 15 minutes. Who can help? Anyone older than 18 years, in good health, weighing at least 110 pounds is eligible to donate. Make sure you eat within 2 hours prior and drink plenty of water 24 - 48 hours beforehand. Please bring your ID. FYI: You must wait 8 weeks between blood donations. See page 6 to set your appointment via QR code.


